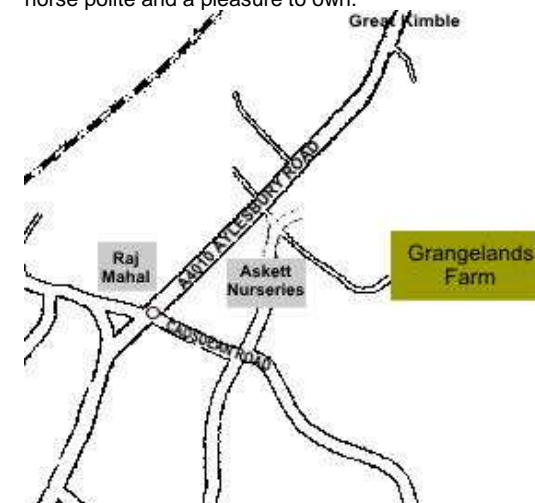
Worming will be carried out as routine and is included. Shavings to be provided by livery if required.

Terms; Paper bills will be issued four weekly, payable within seven days or by standing order – any extras in arrears.

All clients will agree to the terms and conditions of the livery contract.



We aim to create a friendly yard with everything running in an ordered way, where horses and humans know the routine and high standards that are expected. We have learnt by experience gained over the last 15 years, but like to think we are still progressing and improving, so with this in mind we are more than happy to discuss any requirements you have and try to be accommodating. Your hobby should be a happy experience, and your horse polite and a pleasure to own.



Grangelands Farm is allocated up an unmarked track off the A4010. The track forks into three at the bottom take the centre fork and proceed up the track which will lead you directly to the farmyard.

Situated in Great Kimble on the main A4010 which runs between Aylesbury and High Wycombe, approx two miles out of Princes Risborough.

The farm is tucked into the Chiltern Hills and adjoined by a bridleway.

A small family run yard on the farm where we live.

Hay and haylage is made on the farm and we bale our own straw.

Marguerite supervises the day to day running of the yard, ably assisted by her daughter Katy who is a qualified instructor and Abi, who trained at the Berkshire College in Equine Studies. Katy and Abi are both happy to assist with the schooling and exercising of your horse and give lessons on your own horse.

Both Katy and Hannah have represented England in pony teams. Katy is very involved with the pony club and particularly enjoys training children for the working hunter pony classes and has trained young riders towards achieving a place in the England squad. She is also on the Ponies (UK) panel of "Elite Trainers" and a panel judge of working hunter ponies.

Clipping, trimming, mane and tail pulling are no problem, and we pride ourselves on the high standard of turn out of horses competing from our yard, whether it be a local show, Pony Club, riding club or a major championship.

FACILITIES - Our stables are of two equine designs, traditional half doors and tubby boxes with sliding doors. Our building favours the American barn style.

All stables have Kraiberg rubber matting and automatic drinkers, large hay bins for unrestricted forage and a

choice of hay or haylage.

We have inside and outside horse wash facilities with hot and cold water.

All stables have a rug rack for rugs used on a daily basis. We have equine stocks for veterinary use, mane and tail pulling if necessary.

There is a purpose built locker room, with a locker for each stable to store your personal belongings and secure with your own padlock.

A secure tack room with saddle and bridle racks for each stable and a large saddle horse for tack cleaning.

The stables are fitted with alarms linked to a private security system.

We have a client refreshment room for making hot drinks and also a changing room with toilet and shower facilities.

A rug room where rugs not in daily use may be stored.

We offer some of the best off road hacking.

OUTSIDE - Our ménage is very large and facilitates jumping, flat work and is floodlit.

We have a set of show jumps, and a wide variety of working hunter fences including water trays.

PADDOCKS - All our paddocks are fenced with electrical fencing, horses here are kept in pairs (maybe three, if restricted grazing is required) and have a pair of paddocks so one can be resting. The paddocks are mechanically "poo picked" and kept clean. All grass is sprayed, rolled, harrowed and topped if necessary.



EQUINE CARE - Our Horses are hand fed twice daily. The content and quantity of feed will always be agreed with the client. Forage is fed without restriction, unless weight control is needed. Horses will be turned out and brought in by us, rugs changed and feet picked out. Turnout is daily, weather permitting, when horses are left in, at our own discretion, they will be skipped out and given extra

hay. We aim not to leave our horses stabled for more than three consecutive days unless very wet or icy weather persists.

WORMING - Worming is carried out by us on a regular basis, from directives personally provided by our Veterinary Surgeon.

FARRIER - Our Farrier visits on a regular basis, we shall attend to the visit as long as funds have been left to pay the Farrier on the day. Other Farriers may attend the yard, but their visits are arranged and attended by the client concerned.



VETS - In the case of an emergency we will call out your Veterinary Surgeon. Every attempt will be made to contact you first by telephone, to ensure the welfare of your horse. Routine visits will be posted on the noticeboard to enable the sharing of costs where appropriate. All horses kept here must be fully vaccinated and have an equine passport.

YARD RULES - We have a livery contract and agreement to be signed by clients on arrival. Basic rules are posted on noticeboards around the yard as reminders, and our policies are set out in our yard contract which we require all clients to read and sign. These are based on common sense and are compiled for everyone's safety. We aim to create a friendly yard with everything running in an ordered way, where horses and humans know the routine and standards expected.
